# TAVISTOCK TOWN COUNCIL PANNIER MARKET REPORT 12th April 2022 DATE OF REPORT 04/04/22

## 1. General Update

- a) Since the last report there has been some slight reshuffling in the Pannier Market, and some changes to several 5-day pitches, with some now being occupied at the East end of the market. Colours of Creation have now returned after 20 years of trading, and we have welcomed Annie's Craft Supplies in their place. We also welcome back a few traders that have had to take a short break due to personal reasons.
- b) As we move into the Easter Holidays, we look forward to a spike in visitors as March has been fairly quiet in comparison to the numbers witnessed in between lock downs last year. Traders are planning an Easter Bonnet competition and the Mayor has been invited to do the Judging.
- c) All Lock-Up units are now leased out, with the latest one occupied being the one that was previously being used as a temporary office during Coronvirus, this features new business Between The leaves, an array of tropical and indoor plants and accessories.
- d) Please note, we are now charging at the new rate of £10 per table, this came into operation as of April 1<sup>st</sup> 2022.

#### 2. Coach Drivers Initiative

- a) We are yet to witness a steady amount of coaches visit, but with the holiday season upon us and the slow regrowth of the coach industry, we expect to start noticing an upturn in numbers.
- b) It has been discussed that can add the Guild Hall as an attraction into the coach drivers pack, as way of adding another reason for Tavistock to be chosen as a destination for coach parties.

### 6. Tavistock Country Show

Organisation for this event has without doubt been challenging due to the tight time constraints and the staffing capacity issues, however, with support within the existing organisational staffing structure, interest and bookings have been extremely positive, and we fully expect to deliver a successful event this year. We have managed to secure six show gardens, and have filled the internal section of the Pannier Market, with the perimeter also hosting an array of country delights and Bedford Square focusing on a mixture of sellers, charities and community led projects. The Guild Hall Carpark will host the food section, bar and entertainment.
