TAVISTOCK TOWN COUNCIL PANNIER MARKET REPORT 1st MARCH 2022 DATE OF REPORT 21/01/22

1. General Update

- a) Footfall has been slow through this period, however there has been a slight increase as we move towards half term, the recent weather has not helped in attracting people to the Pannier Market, but it is fully expected that as we move towards the spring we will start to witness an increase in visitors.
- b) Since the last report, there has been numerous new traders applying and starting at the Market, and some reconfigurations of some of the five day traders. Some of the new traders have been of the younger generation which very positive to see within the Market sector, it goes to show that market stalls are a good way for young entrepreneurs to start up in business.
- c) Please not that due to the recent Storm Eunice, the decision was taken to close the Pannier Market & Town Hall on Friday 18th February as a safety precaution, many of the traders/hirers travel quite a distance to attend, so with the warnings advising against nonessential travel, management felt this was the sensible option.
- d) Some trader consultation has been undertaken in relation to the pending Queens Jubilee, with the desire of the majority of traders to stay open across the Bank Holiday. We also plan to have a red, white and blue theme on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday to support the celebrations with other key stakeholders, we will also erect the red, white and blue around the market perimeter, these are early ideas, and more may be added as the plans for Town as a whole unfold.
- e) Please note that we are currently still trading at the reduced offer rate of £8.00, this will return to the normal rate of £9.00 as of the 1^{st} March, the new rate 0f £10.00 will come into fruition as of 1^{st} April 2022. All traders.

2. Coach Drivers Initiative

a) As we approach the Spring, we fully expect an upturn in coach numbers at the start of this season, with Tavistock firmly on the map as popular visitor destination, the first signs coming from industry sources are that they expect high visitor numbers now the restrictions are all but gone.

b) After discussions with the BID and with our working partner who delivers the coach drivers incentive pack, we are looking at simplifying and revamping the coach drivers leaflet to be more appealing directly to the tour operators. The Dartmoor day tour is still in operation, however at this point the route consists of the Pannier Market and House of Marbles, we are hoping the Old Police Station Café at Princetown comes back on board this season as numbers should no longer be affected by Covid.

4. Bedford Square/Events

- a) With a mixture of adverse weather and the time of year, Bedford Square has predominantly featured the more regular traders on a daily basis and also continues to host the biweekly Farmers Market.

- c) The dates for the 2022 Street Food events hosted by Miss Ivy have now been confirmed as, Saturday 30th April, Saturday 30th July, Saturday 27th August and Saturday 24th September, operating hours will be approximately 5pm-8pm and will be on Bedford Square and also encompass the Guild Hall carpark.

5. Designated Premises Supervisor

Recent bar led functions have been limited through this period, so no issues to report this time around, apart from one recent private function which reported healthy bar sales, with no licensing issues.

6. Tavistock Country Show

There has been a very positive response to the show going ahead this year, with all areas being booked up quickly. The interior of the Pannier Market will predominantly nurseries and show gardens, the perimeter will be a mixture of nurseries and gardenalia, Bedford Square will feature a mixture of garden and country related stalls and informative talks and the Guild Hall carpark will host some entertainment and refreshment area.

It has been a tight turnaround with a lot still to do with around nine weeks left, so now there is a focus around receiving payments and compiling the advertising.
