TAVISTOCK TOWN COUNCIL PANNIER MARKET REPORT JULY/AUGUST 2023 DATE OF REPORT 17/07/2023

PANNIER MARKET

1. General Update

- a) We are currently primarily focused around table allocation and marketing of the Summer Monday opening, this begins on July 17th for a run of six weeks, we previously coincided it with the traditional school six week break, however this meant ending on the August Bank Holiday Monday, which historically was a very quiet day for the Pannier Market, so after trader consultation we decided to bring the six weeks of opening a week forward, this captures the schools that break up earlier and ends on a more positive trading day.
- b) Barclays are now operating from their new location within the Pannier Market, the installation of the Pod is currently planned for Sunday 23rd July, however there has been a slight delay in drawing up the terms & conditions, these will need to be signed off before the Pod installation can commence.
- c) We continue to monitor incoming applications, however currently there seems to be an influx of similar products coming in especially jewellery, and the Pannier Market has always prided itself on the variety and range available and safe guarding existing businesses/traders from too much cross over of product type, which creates a healthy balance of competition without becoming over saturated.
- d) In general, as we move towards the school holidays, we are starting to witness an upturn in footfall and visitor numbers, especially foreign ones, which is nice to see after a difficult trading period and the current economic climate. Saturdays have remained busy throughout the year with customers choosing to visit Tavistock regularly.

2. Bedford Square/Events

- a) We continue have our regular traders on a weekly basis, however please note, we have had to be slightly cautionary with additional bookings whilst we ascertain the full impact on the overall footprint of the Square regarding the Town Hall front elevation scaffolding, early suggestions are that although slightly reduced, the impact should be fairly minimal.
- b) One event the scaffolding has affected is the Miss Ivy Street Food events, due to the uncertainty of the impact at the time, the decision was taken to move June's event to the Meadows, there is no event in July, but they have decided to also stage the August one in the Meadows, as even with a small section of the square being not accessible, does not lend itself well to the large amount of footfall that the Street Food attracts.
