

Pannier Market Report July/August 2018

General Update

- Footfall remains steady since the re-opening with a good mix of tourists visiting this year. There has been a slight tweak to the redesigned lay out due to concerns from some traders, this involved unblocking two of the aisles on the south side of the market, feedback since the change has been positive.
- Our Market perimeter has had three new businesses open recently, Rabbit Rabbit opened in July offered an eclectic range of vintage wares, Devon & Moor who offer giftware and souvenirs, most recently Love Dolly who offers a range of soaps and skincare products. All of these business owners have progressed from Market trader to shop owner and now sees 3 East End stores as the only vacant perimeter shop.
- At present the Market has three vacant five day pitches but has recently had some potential interest from existing day traders. In the past few months there has been several new traders start at the market mainly on a Wednesday and Thursday.
- Consultation has taken place with perimeter shops to ascertain a favoured commencement period for the Public Realm works, an update from the General Manager will be going out to shops and traders this week.
- Work is taking place with traders to review the temperature and light levels at different locations within the Market.

Bedford Square

With the favourable weather conditions we have seen an increase in income on Bedford square at this time of year in comparison with 2017.

We will look to host more events on Bedford Square from September-December now that the Arts Market is being hosted in Butchers Hall, this will free up the first Saturday of the month for additional bookings.

Events

Tavi Arts Market is now being held in the Butchers' Hall for the Autumn/Winter months and will be held as usual on the first Saturday of the month. Feedback from the September event was that footfall in the hall was good with a nice atmosphere.

The previous NCCPG Plant Fair usually held in March had to be cancelled due to poor weather conditions; this was due to be held on Bedford Square whilst the main Pannier Market was closed for the improvement works. Their end of Summer event will be held inside the market hall as usual on Sunday 16th September.

Social Media

Social Media has played a pivotal part as the driving force behind advertisement for our celebrity trail. Provisional figures indicate that over 1,000 trail forms have been completed with an average of 3 people per sheet participating. Of those taking part 532 people have a PL postcode and the rest of the country make up a further 494 trail sheets. Out of the visitor postcodes the Home Counties proved to be a popular visitors destination especially Kent and Essex.

Our social media views are expected to well in advance of 100,000 and our Facebook page has had an increase in hits and likes. The feedback for the event has been extremely positive with some great prizes given out for free. There be a winners draw on Tuesday 11/09/2018 to win a 50" 4K TV, this prize was funded half by traders and half by ABC Services who will present the award.
