A1 (Town Clerk) – This is difficult to answer as the ratio of interments v cremations needs to be factored in, and the green burial area is not currently being utilised fully.

However, we would estimate 20 – 25 years. This however would decrease significantly if there was a return to more traditional burials.

Funds have been set aside to look for suitable land, however this is not easy to find in an appropriate location. If any members of the public, or Councillors, are aware of any land which might fit the purpose, the Council would be grateful to receive this information.

Thanks were conveyed to the Mayor and Deputy Mayor for their comprehensive reports. Thanks were also conveyed to all Councillors for the part they had played during the pandemic, and for their ongoing commitment to the Town, which was felt demonstrated the importance of Local Government.
