PANNIER MARKET

1. General Update

- a) We have observed an increase in footfall during the recent spell of favourable weather, with a noticeable rise in the number of visitors and tourists. However, during periods of very high temperatures, there has been a slight decrease in activity during the afternoons, which is to be expected. Notably, for the first time this year—and indeed in recent times—we have welcomed a healthy number of coaches. These have included a mix of returning groups and new operators, many of whom have become aware of our incentive through word-of-mouth recommendations within the coach industry.
- b) Bookings for the Monday opening have been fairly challenging, with traders being slightly more cautious in committing to trade for any extra days, with the additional cost implications, however there is still enough uptake to ensure the market looks vibrant, with those that visit still having a pleasant shopping experience, and the perimeter and Highstreet shops will hopefully benefit from the additional footfall that the market being open brings to the town.
- c) With the positive volume of visitors and the fine weather this year, additional we have had an abundance of new traders who have started over the past few weeks. Admittedly, a few have succumbed to the difficult trading climate, however it is positive to see new business launching, and choosing to do so at the Pannier Market. There has been a welcome return for local business Pens & Moor, who specialise in engraving and accessories, and was a former trader at the Market before progressing to the Highstreet, his return was met with extremely positive comments on our Social Media platforms.
- d) As previously discussed, one of our lock-up units has now been taken on by existing traders The Artisan Merchants, this now sees them expand their presence in the Market, with two businesses both trading five days a week. They will be launching their latest venture from the unit on Monday 21st July. We shall look to help them promote this on Social Media and ask the local Gazette to feature them as another new business in the town.
